EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Proclamation is to commence the provisions of the Anti-Discrimination (Age Discrimination) Act 1993. The Act amends the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 to make it unlawful for persons to discriminate against others on the ground of their age.

The Act itself provides that that part of section 49ZYI that renders it unlawful for an employer to discriminate against a person on the ground of age on the basis that the position concerned is only available for a junior employee is not to commence until a proclaimed day that is not to be earlier than 2 years after the commencement of the new Pm inserted in the Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 by the Act; that is, not earlier than 2 years after 1 July 1994.
