COMMERCIAL VESSELS ACT 1979—REGULATION

(Relating to fees, expenses and charges)

NEW SOUTH WALES

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the Commercial Vessels Act 1979, has been pleased to make the Regulation set forth hereunder.

Commencement

1. This Regulation commences on 2 February 1996.

Amendments

2. The Commercial Vessels (Permits) Regulation 1986 is amended:

- (a) by inserting in alphabetical order in clause 4 the following definitions:

“normal working hours” means 7.30 am to 4 pm Monday to Friday, excluding public holidays;

“Waterways Authority” means the Waterways Authority constituted under the Ports Corporatisation and Waterways Management Act 1995.

- (b) by inserting at the end of clause 14 the following subclauses:

(2) If Schedule 3 provides for a charge to be imposed at an hourly rate, the Minister is to provide a written estimate of the total fee payable before the relevant work is commenced.

(3) The fee payable in respect of a vessel whose survey schedule is altered (such as for the purpose of including the vessel

in a group survey) is to be increased or decreased in the same proportion as that by which the interval before the vessel is next due for survey is increased or decreased as a result of the alteration.

(c) by omitting Schedule 3 and by inserting instead the following Schedule:

8. Issue of a Class 4 permit in respect of a vessel that is less than 6 metres long and that is subject to an exemption from periodical survey under section 48	\$107 (for each group of 10 vessels, or part of such a group)
9. Issue of a replacement survey record book (clause 10 (7))	\$120
10. Issue of a towage permit (clause 12): Administration fee	\$50
In addition, for any inspection of a vessel for that purpose	\$90 per hour or part of an hour
11. Further inspection, where a defect or deficiency has been revealed by an inspection under section 29, for the purpose of ascertaining whether the defect or deficiency has been rectified	\$90 per hour or part of an hour

Part 2—Supplementary charges payable in addition to the fees, expenses and charges under Part 1

Attendance by a surveyor (at the request of an applicant for a vessel permit, or of a person submitting a vessel for survey, inspection or issue of a towage permit) otherwise than at a place or time at which the surveyor is normally engaged in official duties	Such reasonable travel and accommodation expenses as are incurred by the surveyor for the purposes of the attendance

EXPLANATORY NOTE

Section 17 of the Commercial Vessels Act 1979 states that the regulations under that Act may provide for the payment of specified fees and charges in respect of an application for a permit (authorising the use of the vessel to which it relates in prescribed waters of a class or classes specified in the permit) and investigation of the application. Section 30 of that Act provides for the payment of prescribed fees, charges and expenses before a vessel is surveyed or a motor is checked.

The object of this Regulation is to amend the Commercial Vessels (Permits) Regulation 1986 to change the fees and charges presently prescribed under that Regulation.

This Regulation is made under the Commercial Vessels Act 1979, including section 17 (payment of fees, charges and expenses in relation to permits), section 30 (fees, charges and expenses for surveys of vessels and checks of motors) and section 52 (the general regulation-making power).
