JUSTICES ACT 1902—REGULATION

(Relating to short descriptions of offences concerning bicycle rack number-plates)

HIS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the Justices Act 1902, has been pleased to make the Regulation set forth hereunder.

The Justices (Short Descriptions of Motor Traffic and Other Offences) Regulation 1986 is amended by inserting in Schedule 1 after the last of the matter relating to Regulations 104 (1) (d) and (2) and 129 of the Motor Traffic Regulations 1935 the following matter:

Regulations 104 (5) (a), (6)— standdrive motor vehicle on public street with bicycle rack number-plate not securely affixed to bicycle rack securely affixed to rear of vehicle	stand/drive vehicle with bike plate/rack not securely affixed
Regulations 104 (5) (b), (6)— standdrive motor vehicle on public street with bicycle rack number-plate not placed parallel to rear axle and no part of plate higher than 1.7m from the ground	stand/drive vehicle with bike plate not parallel to axle/with part bike plate above 1.7m from ground

Regulations 104 (5) (c), (6)— stand/drive motor vehicle on public street with bicycle rack number-plate not able to be clearly seen from roadway or either footpath at distance of 5m to rear of vehicle	stand/drive vehicle with bike plate not visible from road/ footpath
Regulations 104 (5) (d), (6)— drive motor vehicle on public street between sunset and sunrise with bicycle rack number-plate not illuminated so as to render visible at distance of 20m each letter, symbol or figure on the plate	drive vehicle at night (bike plate letter/symbol/figure not lit)
Regulations 104 (5) (e), (6)— stand/drive motor vehicle on public street with bicycle rack number-plate not having same distinguishing number as registration number of vehicle	stand/drive vehicle (bike plate of different registration number)

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The object of this Regulation is to provide short descriptions of offences relating to bicycle rack number-plates under the Motor Traffic Regulations 1935.

This Regulation is made under the Justices Act 1902, including sections 145B (Short description of certain offences) and 154 (the general regulation-making power).
