Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe a fee of \$100 to accompany an application for a permit for tourist activities or educational purposes under section 148 of the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1982*. The fee payable under that section will also apply to similar permits granted under section 48C of the *Mines Inspection Act 1901*.

This Regulation is made in connection with the commencement of certain provisions of the *Mining Legislation Amendment Act 1996* that amend the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1982* and the *Mines Inspection Act 1901*.

This Regulation is made under the *Coal Mines Regulation Act 1982*, including section 174 (the general regulation making power) and section 148.

1 Name of Regulation

For the purposes of section 148 (1A) of the Act, the fee required to accompany an application for a permit under that section is \$100.
