Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe section 131 (Penalty notices) of the *Rural Fires Act 1997* as a prescribed provision of an Act for the purposes of the definition of penalty notice in Part IVB of the *Justices Act 1902*. The amendment will apply the system for dealing with offences set out in Part IVB to offences under the *Rural Fires Act 1997* and regulations prescribed under section 131 of that Act.

This Regulation is made under the Justices Act 1902, including sections 100I and 154 (the general regulation making power).

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 1997.
