Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to increase the fee payable for a licence to manufacture drugs of addiction from \$395 to \$405. The increase does not apply to public institutions.

This Regulation is made under section 24 of the *Poisons and Therapeutic Goods Act 1966*, in particular section 24 (1) (f).
