# Pharmacy (General) Amendment Regulation 1997

under the

Pharmacy Act 1964

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Pharmacy Act 1964*.

## Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to allow graduates of the pharmacy course at Charles Sturt University to be registered as pharmacists under the *Pharmacy Act 1964*. At present, section 13 (1) of that Act provides that a person is entitled to be registered as a pharmacist if, among other things, the person has passed through a regular graded course in pharmacy of at least 3 years' duration at the University of Sydney or any other prescribed university in New South Wales. This Regulation makes Charles Sturt University a prescribed university for the purposes of that section.

This Regulation is made under the *Pharmacy Act 1964*, including section 3 (definition of Prescribed), section 13 (1) (a) (relating to prescribed universities) and section 38 (the general regulation making power).
