Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to enable voting at polls under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1983* to be optional, as is the case with elections under that Act. Voting in polls has previously been compulsory.

This Regulation is made under the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1983*, including section 163 (the general regulation making power) and sections 39 and 101.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Marketing of Primary Products (Polls and Elections) Further Amendment Regulation 1997*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 19 December 1997.

3 Amendment of Marketing of Primary Products (Polls and Elections) Regulation 1995

The *Marketing of Primary Products (Polls and Elections) Regulation 1995* is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

4 Notes

The explanatory note does not form part of this Regulation.

Schedule 1 Amendments

(Clause 3)

[1] Clause 7 Notice of poll

Omit clause 7 (3). Insert instead:

- (3) The notice must also state that it is compulsory for persons who are entitled to vote in the poll to be enrolled, or to apply for enrolment, in the final roll for the poll.

[2] Clause 16

Omit the clause. Insert instead:

16 Voting optional

Voting at a poll is not compulsory.
