# Rural Lands Protection Amendment (Pig Dogging) Regulation 1998

under the

Rural Lands Protection Act 1989

## Explanatory note

Under Part 9 of the *Rural Lands Protection Act 1989*, a rural lands protection board for a district may order the owner or occupier of land within that district to suppress or destroy noxious animals (such as feral pigs) by any method prescribed by the *Rural Lands Protection Regulation 1995* specified in the order.

The object of this Regulation is to remove “dogging” as a prescribed method for the eradication of noxious animals.

This Regulation is made under the *Rural Lands Protection Act 1989*, including sections 127 and 217 (the general regulation-making power).
