Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Occupational Health and Safety Legislation (Short Descriptions of Offences) Regulation 1996*, as a result of the commencement of the *Road and Rail Transport (Dangerous Goods) Act 1997*:

- (a) to remove obsolete references to repealed provisions, and
- (b) to make a consequential amendment.

This Regulation is made under the *Justices Act 1902*, including section 145B and section 154 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Occupational Health and Safety Legislation (Short Descriptions of Offences) Amendment Regulation 1998*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 20 April 1998.
