Explanatory note

Clause 15 of the *Radiation Control Regulation 1993* requires employers to ensure that employees who are involved in the use of ionising radiation for certain specified purposes are issued with approved personal monitoring devices for detecting and measuring cumulative exposure to ionising radiation.

The object of this Regulation is to specify diagnostic radiology as a purpose for which approved personal monitoring devices for detecting and measuring cumulative exposure to ionising radiation are to be issued by employers to such persons in such circumstances.

This Regulation is made under the *Radiation Control Act 1990*, including section 40, in particular section 40 (1) (the general regulation-making power) and (3) (a) and (i).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Radiation Control Amendment Regulation 1998*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 July 1998.

3 Amendment of Radiation Control Regulation 1993
