Motor Traffic Regulations Amendment (Loading Offences) Regulation 1998

under the

Traffic Act 1909

His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Traffic Act 1909*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Motor Traffic Regulations 1935* to enable the following offences to be dealt with by penalty notice and to specify as the maximum penalties if they are so dealt with the amounts set out opposite the offences:

Offences under regulation 118A of the *Motor Traffic Regulations 1935* (relating to requirements for loads on motor vehicles and trailers to be safely loaded and secured) \$250

Offences under clause 35 of the *Road Transport (Muss, Loading and Access) Regulation 1996* (relating to requirements for loads on heavy vehicles to be safely loaded and secured) \$500

This Regulation is made under the *Traffic Act 1909*, including section 18B and section 3 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Motor Traffic Regulations Amendment (Loading Offences) Regulation 1998*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 24 July 1998.
