Public Health Amendment (Scheduled Medical Conditions) Regulation 1998

Explanatory note

The *Public Health Act 1991* imposes a number of requirements relating to various medical conditions. The conditions are listed in different categories with the requirements varying between those categories. In the case of a Category 3 medical condition, a person suffering from such a condition is required to take reasonable steps against spreading it and a testing laboratory is required to notify the Director-General of the Department of Health when a test for such a condition returns a positive result.

The object of this Regulation is to add five medical conditions to the Category 3 medical conditions listed in the Act.

This Regulation is made under the *Public Health Act 1991*, including section 80.
