## Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1997 No 55—Proclamation

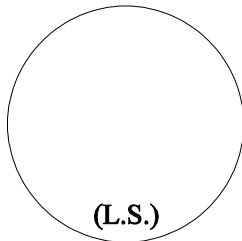

### Explanatory note

The object of this proclamation is to commence the provision of the *Statute Law (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1997* that repeals section 97 of the *Transport Administration Act 1988*. Section 97 created offences concerning failure to pay train fares. Those offences are now created by section 79A of the *Rail Safety Act 1993* (inserted in the latter Act by Schedule 2.3 [3] to the *Transport Administration (Light Rail) Act 1996*).
