Public Sector Management (Ministry of Energy and Utilities) Order 2000

Explanatory note

The object of this Order is to repeal a subclause of an order that made provision for the transfer of certain staff from the Department of Energy to the Department of Fair Trading, when the Department of Energy was abolished and the Ministry of Energy and Utilities was established.

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Explanatory note

The Department of Fair Trading was assigned the responsibility for matters of consumer protection formerly assigned to the Department of Energy, and it was intended that the staff of the abolished Department of Energy principally involved in those matters would be transferred to the Department of Fair Trading.

However, no staff were within the category covered by the subclause, and the responsibility for those matters is to be transferred to the Ministry of Energy and Utilities. The repeal of the subclause reflects this transfer of responsibility.

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1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Public Sector Management (Ministry of Energy and Utilities) Order 2000*.

2 Repeal of clause 12 (1) of Public Sector Management (General) Order 1999

Clause 12 (1) of the *Public Sector Management (General) Order 1999* is repealed.

3 Consequential amendment

Clause 12 (2) of the *Public Sector Management (General) Order 1999* is amended by omitting “other”.
