Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to prescribe the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1996* of the Northern Territory and the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1997* of the Australian Capital Territory in relation to interstate recognition certificates for transgender persons. The proposed amendment will enable a person to whom a certificate has been issued under those Acts to be legally recognised in New South Wales as a person of the sex as stated in the certificate.

This Regulation is made under the *Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1995*, including sections 32I (Effect of alteration of register and interstate recognition certificates) and 62 (the general regulation-making power).
