Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to extend the operation of the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection—Child Employment) (Savings and Transitional) Regulation 2004* until 1 April 2005. (That regulation applies the *Children (Care and Protection—Child Employment) Regulation 2001* made under the *Children (Care and Protection) Act 1987* as if it were a regulation made under the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998* and is due to expire on 1 February 2005.)

This Regulation is made under the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998*, including section 264 (the general regulation-making power) and clause 1 of Schedule 3.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection—Child Employment) (Savings and Transitional) Amendment Regulation 2005*.

**2 Amendment of Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection—
Child Employment) (Savings and Transitional) Regulation 2004**

The *Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection—Child Employment) (Savings and Transitional) Regulation 2004* is amended by omitting “ceases to have effect on 1 February 2005” from clause 7 (Repeal of Regulation) and by inserting instead “is repealed at the beginning of 1 April 2005”.
