His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition)* Act 2014.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to recognise certain licences issued under laws of other States and a Territory and to prescribe certain local licences as equivalent to those licences. (The *Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition) Act 2014* provides for the automatic mutual recognition of occupational licences issued in other jurisdictions that are prescribed as recognised licences, so that an individual who holds a recognised licence will be deemed to hold the equivalent New South Wales licence.)

This Regulation is made under the *Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition) Act 2014*, including the definitions of *local licence* and *recognised licence* in section 3 (1), section 4 (1) (which provides for the regulations to prescribe that a local licence is equivalent to a recognised licence) and section 13 (the general regulation-making power).

This Regulation comprises or relates to matters set out in Schedule 3 to the Subordinate Legislation Act 1989, namely matters of a machinery nature.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition) Regulation 2014.*

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 December 2014 and is required to be published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Definitions

(1) In this Regulation:

the Act means the Mutual Recognition (Automatic Licensed Occupations Recognition) Act 2014.

(2) Notes included in this Regulation do not form part of this Regulation.

4 Local licences, recognised licences and deemed local licences

- (1) For the purposes of the definition of *local licence* in section 3 (1) of the Act, each licence that is listed in Column 2 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as a local licence.
- (2) For the purposes of the definition of *recognised licence* in section 3 (1) of the Act, each licence issued under a law of another jurisdiction that is listed in Column 1 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as a recognised licence.
- (3) For the purposes of section 4 (1) of the Act, each local licence listed in Column 2 of the table in Schedule 1 is prescribed as equivalent to the recognised licence or group of licences listed alongside it in Column 1.
