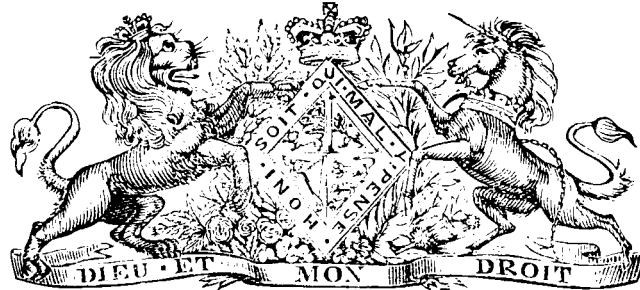

An Act to reduce the proportion of Members of the Legislative Council required to form a Quorum. [10th July, 1890.]

CONSTITUTION ACT
AMENDMENT.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. After the passing of this Act wherever in the eighth section of the Act of the Imperial Legislature, eighteenth and nineteenth Victoria chapter fifty-four (commonly known as the "Constitution Act"), the expression "one-third" occurs the expression "one-fourth" shall be substituted and read ; and where in the said section the word "three" occurs the word "four" shall in like manner be substituted and read, to the intent that the quorum of the Legislative Council now prescribed by law should be one-fourth instead of one-third of the Members of the said Council, exclusive of the President.

Alteration of quorum of Legislative Council.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Constitution Act Amendment Act of 1890."
