An Act to vest certain land at Broken Hill in Broken Hill SITE. TRADES HALL SITE. Trustees on trust for the erection of a Trades $\lfloor 6th\ December,\ 1898.

THEREAS by section one of the Silverton Tramway Act of 1886 Preamble. certain persons were authorised to make and construct a certain tramway across the lands described in the Schedule to that Act, and to take and use so much of the said lands as might be required for the purposes of such tramway: And whereas all the rights, powers, authorities, privileges, liabilities, and obligations conferred and imposed upon the said persons by the said Act were under the provisions of section fifty-four of that Act assigned, transferred, conveyed, and released to the Silverton Tramway Company (Limited): And whereas the land described in the Schedule to this Act was at the time of the passing of the said Silverton Tramway Act Crown lands and formed part of the lands described in the Schedule to the said Silverton Tram-And whereas in the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one the said company surrendered all its rights, title, interest, claims, and demands whatsoever to, in, or upon the piece of land described in the Schedule to this Act: And whereas on the fifteenth September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, the Governor, by notice in the Gazette, dedicated the land described in the Schedule to this Act as a site for mechanics' institute, museum, hall, or other institution for public amusement: And whereas it is expedient that the

land described in the Schedule to this Act should be vested in trustees on trust for the erection of a trades hall: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Land vested in trustees for the trades hall,

1. All the estate, right, title, and interest to the land described erection thereon of a in Schedule hereto is hereby vested in nine trustees to be elected from time to time under the provisions of the by-laws of the Barrier District

> Council of the Australian Labour Federation, being a registered society under the Trades Union Act of 1881. Such trustees shall be trustees for the purposes of the Trades Hall, and shall be superseded from time to time by their successors as elected under such by-laws; and the said land shall be vested in the said trustees from time to time without the necessity for any conveyance or assignment whatsoever, and the trustees for the time being shall administer the provisions of this Act as though they had been the original trustees until their successors be elected, but subject to the conditions hereinafter expressed, and on trust for the erection and maintenance on the said land of a hall for the use of Trades

> Unions registered under the Trades Union Act, 1881. 2. The trustees in the next preceding section mentioned shall hold the said land subject to the conditions following, that is to say:—

(1) They, the said trustees, shall, within three years from the time of the passing of this Act, erect the hall mentioned in the next preceding section.

(2) They shall within the time aforesaid expend on the erection of the said hall and the buildings connected therewith a sum of not less than five hundred pounds.

And upon the breach of any of the said conditions the said land shall revest in the Crown, and become Crown lands within the meaning of the Crown Lands Acts.

Trustees may make rules.

Conditions.

3. The trustees may make rules for regulating the use of the said hall, but such rules shall have no effect until approved by the Colonial Secretary or the Minister for the time being charged with the administration of the Trades Union Act, 1881.

4. This Act may be cited as the "Broken Hill Trades Hall Site Act of 1898."

SCHEDULE.

All that piece or parcel of land situated in the town of Willyama, parish of Picton, county of Yancowinna, in the Colony of New South Wales: Commencing at a point on the northern side of Sulphide-street; thence north by the building-line of Blendstreet one hundred and ninety-eight feet; thence by a line west sixty-six feet; thence by a line south one hundred and ninety-eight feet; thence by the building-line of Sulphidestreet east sixty-six feet, to the point of commencement,—and containing one rood eight perches or thereabouts.
