

Act No. 41, 1902.

SYDNEY MINT.

An Act to consolidate the enactments relating to the Sydney Mint. [20th August, 1902.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Sydney Mint Act, 1902."

Repeal.

2. The Act twenty-eighth Victoria number three is hereby repealed.

Appropriation in support of Sydney Mint.

3. There shall be payable to His Majesty in every year out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund sums not exceeding in the whole in any year the sum of fifteen thousand pounds for defraying the salaries, contingencies, retiring and other allowances connected with the Sydney branch of the Royal Mint.

How payments to be made and accounted for.

4. The said several sums of money shall be paid by the Treasurer in discharge of warrants issued under the hand of the Governor, and the Treasurer shall account to His Majesty for the same through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury in such manner and form as His Majesty is graciously pleased to direct.

Mint charges to go to Consolidated Revenue Fund.

5. All sums by way of fees, dues, or charges lawfully received or collected at the said Sydney branch shall be accounted for and paid over by the Deputy Master or other proper officer of the said branch to the Treasurer, who shall pay the same into the Consolidated Revenue Fund.
