

## Act No. 4, 1906.

**DOWER ABOLITION.** **An Act to abolish dower; to amend the statute law relating to dower; and for other purposes. [22nd August, 1906.]**

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Dower Abolition Act, 1906."

Dower abolished.

**2.** No widow shall be entitled, nor after the commencement of the Probate Act of 1890 shall any widow be deemed to have been entitled, to dower out of any land or out of any estate or interest in the same.

Saving.

**3.** Nothing in this Act shall affect any rights the subject of proceedings in any court of law or equity pending at the commencement of this Act, or any decision pronounced by a court of competent jurisdiction before the commencement of this Act.
