

STOCK DISEASES (TICK) AMENDMENT ACT.

Act No. 23, 1915.

George V, An Act to amend the Stock Diseases (Tick) Act, No. 23. 1901; and to provide for the appointment of inspectors by the Minister. [Assented to, 6th September, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

| Amendment of Principal Act.
Amendment of s. 2. | 2. The Stock Diseases (Tick) Act, 1901, is amended as follows:—
(1) "Inspector" means the Chief Inspector and any other inspector of cattle or sheep, and includes any person authorised by the Minister to act as such inspector.
(2) By the insertion immediately after section three of the following new section:—
3A. The Minister may authorise any person to act as an inspector. |

| Amendment of s. 8 (c). | (3) Section eight, paragraph (c), by the addition to the paragraph of the words "and to provide crushes, or such other means as he may deem necessary for such purpose." |
| Amendment of s. 12 (e). | (4) Section twelve, paragraph (e), by the omission of the paragraph and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph:—
(e) breaks down or damages any fence, gate, or fastening on or near the boundaries of a quarantine area, or within such area, used for confining stock; or |
