PLOCLAMATIONS VALIDATION ACT.

Act No. 39, 1919.

An Act to validate certain proclamations, orders, George V, regulations, and by-laws; to amend the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, and the Parliamentary Elections (Amendment) Act, 1918; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 23rd December, 1919.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "Proclamations Short title. Validation Act, 1919."

2. (1) The regulations relating to general elections and purporting to have been made under section 3A of the Parliamentary Electorates and Elections Act, 1912, as amended by the Parliamentary Elections (Amendment) Act, 1918, which regulations were laid before the Legislative Assembly on the twenty-first day of August, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, shall have the force of law, and shall be of the same effect as if enacted in the said Act.
