PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES AND SALARIES ACT.

Act No. 2, 1922.

George V, An Act to reduce the allowances to members of the Legislative Assembly and the salaries of Ministers of the Crown and of certain other persons; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Ministers' Salaries Act, 1908, the Parliamentary Representatives Allowance Act, 1912, the Parliamentary Representatives Allowance and Ministers' Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1920, and certain other Acts; and for other purposes. [Assented to, 6th May, 1922.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:--

Short title and commencement.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1922."
- (2) The Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall come into operation on, and shall take effect from, the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-two.
