

## SOUTH-WEST TABLELANDS WATER SUPPLY ACT.

### Act No. 64, 1924.

An Act to sanction the construction of works of water supply for the towns of Cootamundra, Murrumburrah, Stockinbingal, Temora, Bar-medman, Wyalong, Young, and Grenfell; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 23rd December, 1924.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the "South-west Tablelands Water Supply Act, 1924."

2. The carrying out of the works described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby sanctioned, and the Secretary for Public Works is empowered to carry out the said works.

3. The cost of carrying out the said works, exclusive of land resumptions, is estimated at one million six hundred and sixty-four thousand pounds, and such estimated cost shall not, under any circumstances, be exceeded by more than ten per centum.

4. The plan of the works is the plan marked "South-west Tablelands Water Supply," signed by the Secretary for Public Works, and countersigned by the Chief Engineer for Water Supply and Sewerage, and deposited in the public office of the said Secretary.

## SCHEDULE.

THE scheme comprises:—

- (1) The construction of pumping stations, one on the Murrumbidgee River near Jugiong, another near Demondrille, and auxiliary stations.
- (2) The construction of settling tanks, treatment works, balance tanks, and service reservoirs.
- (3) The construction of pipe lines from Jugiong to Cootamundra, Temora, and Wyalong. Also to Murrumburrah, Young, and Grenfell.
- (4) Service mains and reticulations.
- (5) Electric transmission lines, including crossings over public and private roads.
- (6) Telephone and electric indicator lines.
- (7) Works connected therewith.

The whole to be subject to such deviations and modifications as may be deemed desirable by the Constructing Authority.
