BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

PART II.

STATUTORY ENDOWMENTS, BURSARIES AND SCHOLARSHIPS.

- 3. This Part of this Act shall be deemed to have commence-commenced on the thirtieth day of June, one thousand ment. nine hundred and thirty-one.
- 4. The amount of the annual endowments payable Reduction. out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund in pursuance of the chactments mentioned in the Schedule to this Act shall in the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and in the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, be reduced by twenty per centum.

Sancta Sophia College Building Endowment Fund. 5. 6. (1) The allowances to students in teachers' colleges shall be reduced from the date of the payment of the seventh instalment in the calendar year, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as follows:—

Allowances of eighty pounds per annum to sixtyfour pounds per annum;

Allowances of fifty pounds per annum to forty pounds per annum.

And from the date of the payment of the sixth instalment in the calendar year, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as follows:—

Allowances of sixty-four pounds per annum to fifty-two pounds per annum;

Allowances of forty pounds per annum to twentysix pounds per annum.

Provided that the Minister may authorise the payment of any such allowance at a rate in excess of that provided in this subsection if he is satisfied that special circumstances exist which warrant the payment of such increased rate.

(2) The following scholarships at the University shall be reduced in the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, and in the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, as follows:—

The Alexander Scholarship from ninety pounds per annum to eighty pounds per annum;

The Riverina Scholarship from seventy-five pounds per annum to sixty-five pounds per annum;

The Waradgery Scholarship from ninety pounds per annum to eighty pounds per annum.

- (3) (a) Bursaries awarded under the provisions of the Bursary Endowment Act, 1912, and tenable in secondary schools and at the Sydney University shall be reduced during the period extending from the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, to the thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one, as follows:—
 - Twelve pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to ten pounds and no text-books;
 - Eighteen pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to fourteen pounds and no textbooks;
 - Twenty pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to sixteen pounds and no text-books;
 - Twenty-four pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to nineteen pounds and no text-books;
 - Twenty-five pounds, plus text-books valued at five pounds, to twenty-two pounds and no text-books;
 - Thirty-pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to twenty-three pounds and no text-books:
 - Forty pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to thirty-one pounds and no text-books;
 - Fifty pounds, plus text-books valued at one pound ten shillings, to thirty-eight pounds and no textbooks.
 - Sixty-five pounds, plus text-books valued at five pounds, to fifty pounds and no text-books.
- (b) Such bursaries shall, as from the first day of January, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, and until the amounts specified in this paragraph are varied by regulations made under the Bursary Endowment Act, 1912, be altered to the extent hereinafter indicated, namely:—

Ten pounds to nine pounds twelve shillings; Fourteen pounds to fourteen pounds eight shillings; Sixteen pounds—no alteration;

PAYMENTS FROM MAIN ROADS FUNDS.

County of Cumberland Main Roads Fund.

7. (1) There shall be paid to the Colonial Treasurer from the County of Cumberland Main Roads Fund for credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, during the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, on a date to be determined by the Colonial Treasurer, the sum of fortysix thousand pounds.

Country Fund.

(2) There shall be paid to the Colonial Treasurer Main Roads from the Country Main Roads Fund for credit of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, during the financial year commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-two, on a date to be determined by the Colonial Treasurer, the sum of one hundred and fifty-four thousand pounds.

DISCONTINUANCE OF SPECIAL PURPOSES (REVENUE) FUND.

8. This Part of this Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.

 - (3A) Where any debt to the Crown, to the Water Interest on Conservation and Irrigation Commission or to a certain debts Pastures Protection Board is incurred after the incurred thirty-first day of December, one thousand nine after 31st hundred and thirty-two, under or by operation of the 1932. Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913, the Pastures Protection Act, 1912, the Western Lands Act of 1901, the Irrigation Act, 1912, or any Act amending any of such enactments, and such debt is to bear interest, the maximum rate of such interest shall be four pounds per centum per annum.

12. The Sydney Corporation Act, 1932, is amended Amendment by inserting at the end of subsection five of section one Corporation hundred and eighteen the following paragraph:—

For the purposes of this subsection and of any enactment replaced thereby every technical college and technical school established and conducted by or on behalf of the Crown or the Minister of Public Instruction shall be and shall be deemed always to have been a school under the Public Instruction Act of 1880.
