**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** This Act may be cited as the "Australian Jockey Club (Amendment) Act, 1935." Short title.

**2.** The Australian Jockey Club Act, 1873, is amended by inserting next after section thirty the following new section:—

31. (1) A person may be refused admission to the lands referred to in section ten of this Act or may be expelled therefrom if he is a person for the time being under disqualification by the committee pursuant to the rules of racing of the club for the time being in force, or if there are reasonable grounds for believing that his presence on the said lands would be undesirable in the interests of the public resorting thereto, or prejudicial to the proper conduct of racing.

(2) Subsection one of this section shall be construed as supplemental to and not in derogation of or limited by the foregoing provisions of this Act relating to bylaws.
