

DEMISE OF THE CROWN
(AMENDMENT) ACT.

An Act to amend the Demise of the Crown Act 1901, and the Constitution Act, 1902, in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 11th December, 1936.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Demise of the Crown (Amendment) Act, 1936." Short title.

2. (a) The Demise of the Crown Act, 1901, is amended by inserting at the end of section two the following new subsection:—

(4) In this section “demise of the Crown” shall include a demise of the Crown by or upon abdication.

In this section the word “demise” shall include abdication.
