

LADY EDITH CARPENTER LAND VESTING ACT.

Act No. 6, 1937.

An Act to vest certain lands at Wollstonecraft in His Majesty for certain purposes; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 6th October, 1937.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Lady Edith Carpenter Land Vesting Act, 1937."

Short title

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the thirteenth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six.

2. (1) The land described in the Schedule to this Act is hereby divested from Edith Carpenter and vested in His Majesty.

Vesting of
land.

(2) The land so vested shall, from the commencement of this Act, be deemed to be Crown lands and to be dedicated for hospital purposes in accordance with the provisions of section twenty-four of the Crown Lands Consolidation Act, 1913.

3. All trusts, conditions, covenants, easements and encumbrances which, immediately before the commencement of this Act, affected the land described in the Schedule to this Act in the hands of the said Edith Carpenter are hereby discharged and annulled but only in so far as the same affect the land so vested.
