(a) by inserting next after section ten the following new section:—

Suicide of insured.

10a. A policy for an insurance upon the life of any person, whether issued before or after the commencement of the Life, Fire and Marine Insurance (Amendment) Act, 1938, shall not be and shall be deemed never to have been void or voidable merely on the ground that such person died by his own hand or act, if, upon the true construction of the policy, the insurance company has thereby agreed to pay the sum assured in the events that have happened.

Sec. 1. (Division into Parts.) (b) by omitting from the matter relating to Part II in section one the figures "10" and by inserting in lieu thereof the figures and letter "10".
