An Act to amend the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, and certain other Acts in certain respects; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 29th March, 1941.]

B^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

Short title and citation.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Superannuation) Amendment Act, 1941."

(2) The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended by subsequent Acts, and by this Act, may be cited as the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906-1941.

2. The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended—

- (a) by inserting in section twelve after the words "execution of such duty" the words "or where any person (in this section hereinafter referred to as 'ex-member of the police force') who had been a member of the police force and who, at the date of his death, was entitled to an annual superannuation allowance under this Act, has died from injuries received, while a member of the police force, in the actual execution of the duty of his office";
- (b) by inserting in the same section after the words "dependent upon the member of the police force" the words "or, as the case may be, upon the exmember of the police force."
