

# POLICE REGULATION (SUPERANNUATION) AMENDMENT ACT.

Act No. 1, 1944.

An Act to make certain provisions in relation to members of the police force who are killed or injured whilst travelling to or from duty and members and certain ex-members of the police force who die from injuries so received; for this purpose to amend the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 22nd March, 1944.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

**1.** (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Regulation (Superannuation) Amendment Act, 1944." Short title and citation.

(2) The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906-1944.

**2.** The Police Regulation (Superannuation) Act, 1906, as amended by subsequent Acts, is amended— Amendment of Act No. 28, 1906.

(a) (i) by inserting in section ten after the word "disabled" the letter and symbols "(a)"; Sec. 10. (Disablement in execution of duty.)

(ii) by inserting in the same section after the words "duty of his office" the following word and new paragraph:—

"or

(b) by any wound or injury received, without his own default or wilful act, on any of the daily or other periodic journeys referred to in section

section 10A of this Act, which wound or injury is not received—

- (i) during or after any substantial interruption of, or substantial deviation from, any such journey made for a reason unconnected with his duty; or
- (ii) during or after any other break in any such journey which, having regard to all the circumstances, is not reasonably incidental to any such journey.”

- (b) by inserting next after section ten the following new section:—

10A. The daily or other periodic journeys referred to in sections ten and twelve of this Act shall be the daily or other periodic journeys—

- (a) between the place of residence of the member of the police force and the police station or police call box or other place to which he is attached; or
- (b) between the place of residence of the member of the police force or the police station or police call box to which he is attached and a point or place to which he has been detailed to perform duty.

- (c) by inserting in section twelve after the words “duty of his office” where secondly occurring the words “or where any member of the police force has, without his own default or wilful act, been killed or has died from injuries received, without his own default or wilful act, on any of the daily or other periodic journeys referred to in section 10A of this Act, or any person (in this section hereinafter referred to as ‘ex-member of the police force’) who had been a member of the police force and who, at the date of his death, was entitled to an annual superannuation allowance under this Act, has died from injuries

injuries received, while a member of the police force and without his own default or wilful act, on any of the daily or other periodic journeys referred to in section 10A of this Act, and in any of such cases the occurrence resulting in such death did not happen or such injuries were not received—

- (a) during or after any substantial interruption of, or substantial deviation from, any such journey made for a reason unconnected with his duty; or
  - (b) during or after any other break in such journey which, having regard to all the circumstances, was not reasonably incidental to any such journey.”
