> **B**^E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :----

Short title and citation.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Jury (Amendment) Act, 1951".

(2) The Jury Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Jury Act, 1912-1951.

Amendment of Act No.

2. The Jury Act, 1912-1947, is amended—

- (a) by omitting from paragraph (a) of subsection one of section seventy-five the words "one pound" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "two pounds ten shillings";
- (b) by omitting from paragraph (b) of the same subsection the words "two pounds" and by inserting in lieu thereof the words "five pounds"; (c)

Matrimonial Causes (Amendment) Act.
