ROYAL BLIND SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES ACT.

Act No. 25, 1952.

An Act to alter the name of the body corporate constituted by the Sydney Industrial Blind Institution Incorporation Act, 1901; for that purpose to amend that Act; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 21st October, 1952.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Royal Blind Society of New South Wales Act, 1952."

Amendment of Act No. 56, 1901. 2. The Sydney Industrial Blind Institution Incorporation Act, 1901, is amended by inserting next after section two the following new section:—

New sec. 2a. Change of name of corporation.

- 2A. (1) As from the commencement of the Royal Blind Society of New South Wales Act, 1952:—
 - (a) the name of the body corporate constituted by section two of this Act shall be the Royal Blind Society of New South Wales;
 - (b) a reference in any Act or other instrument to the Sydney Industrial Blind Institution shall be read and construed as a reference to the Royal Blind Society of New South Wales.
- (2) Nothing contained in the Royal Blind Society of New South Wales Act, 1952, shall prejudice or affect in any way the continuity of the body

body corporate constituted by section two of this No. 25, 1962. Act, but the same shall continue notwithstanding the provisions of the said Act.

(3) The alteration of name effected by subsection one of this section shall not affect any property, powers, rights, authorities, duties, functions, liabilities or obligations of the body corporate constituted by section two of this Act, or render defective any legal or other proceedings instituted or to be instituted by or against the said body corporate.

Any legal or other proceedings may be continued or commenced by or against the body corporate by the name of the Royal Blind Society of New South Wales that might have been continued or commenced by or against the body corporate by the name of the Sydney Industrial Blind Institution.
