Elizabeth II, An Act to exempt persons who are assisted persons within the meaning of the Legal Assistance Act, 1943–1947, from the payment of certain jury fees; for this purpose to amend the Legal Assistance Act, 1943, and certain other Acts, in certain respects; to validate certain matters; and for purposes connected therewith. Short title, citation and commencement. 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Legal Assistance (Amendment) Act, 1953."

(2) The Legal Assistance Act, 1943, as amended by No. 7, 1953. subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Legal Assistance Act, 1943-1953.

(3) Section two of this Act shall be deemed to have commenced upon the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and forty-four.

2. The Legal Assistance Act, 1943-1947, is amended Amendment by inserting at the end of subsection five of section eight $_{17, 1943}^{\text{of Act No.}}$ the words-Sec. 8.

In this subsection "court fees" includes the fees (Endorsepayable under section seventy-five of the Jury Act, ^{ment and} 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts, and under certificate.) section ninety-one of the District Courts Act, 1912, as amended by subsequent Acts.
