

## STAMP DUTIES (AMENDMENT) ACT.

Act No. 17, 1954.

An Act to enable Deputy Commissioners of Stamp duties to be appointed; for this purpose to amend the Stamp Duties Act, 1920-1952; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 20th April, 1954.]

**B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Stamp Duties (Amendment) Act, 1954".

(2) The Stamp Duties Act, 1920, as amended by subsequent Acts and by this Act, may be cited as the Stamp Duties Act, 1920-1954.
