# PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES AND SALARIES (AMENDMENT) ACT.

### Act No. 36, 1963.

Rizabeth II. An Act to make provision with regard to the allowances and salaries of Members of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly and Ministers of the Crown; to amend the Constitution Act, 1902, the Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1956, and certain other Acts; and for purposes connected therewith. [Assented to, 10th October, 1963.]

BE

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by No. 36, 1963 and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows: —

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Short title Allowances and Salaries (Amendment) Act, 1963".

- (2) The Constitution Act, 1902, as amended by subsequent Acts, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.
- (3) This Act shall be deemed to have commenced on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-three.

(2) The proclamations made in pursuance of section Sec. 2. 28A of the Principal Act and published in Gazettes number (Consequential.) fifty-four of eighth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, number twenty-nine of thirtieth day of March, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-two and number thirtyfive of thirteenth day of April, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-two, are hereby revoked.

Any additional payment to which a Member of the Payment of Legislative Council or Member of the Legislative Assembly allowances and salaries. becomes entitled by reason of the amendments made by this Act in respect of the period commencing on the first day of July, one thousand nine hundred and sixty-three, and ending on the date upon which the assent of Her Majesty to this Act is signified, shall be deemed to become due and payable upon the day upon which the first monthly payment to which he is entitled under the Constitution Act, 1902, or the Parliamentary Allowances and Salaries Act, 1956, as amended by subsequent Acts, in respect of a period after the date upon which Her Majesty's assent is so signified becomes due and payable.
