

## LEGAL ASSISTANCE (AMENDMENT) ACT.

### Act No. 42, 1964.

An Act to extend the classes of persons to whom legal assistance may be granted under the Legal Assistance Act, 1943, as amended by subsequent Acts; to validate certain matters; for this purpose to amend that Act, as so amended; and for purposes connected therewith. **B**E it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—
