Interpretation (Amendment).

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Interpretation (Amendment) Act, 1977".

Amendment of Act No. 4, 1897. Sec. 41a. (Application of certain provisions to instruments made under Acts.) 2. The Interpretation Act, 1897, is amended by omitting from section 41A (I) the matter "15" where firstly occurring and by inserting instead the matter "14A, 15".
