Act No. 121, 1981.

An Act to amend various Acts as a consequence of the enactment of the
Police Regulation (Deputy Commissioners) Amendment Act, 1981.
[Assented to, 22nd December, 1981.]

Miscellaneous Acts (Deputy Commissioners of Police) Amendment.

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of New South Wales in Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the "Miscellaneous Acts (Deputy Commissioners of Police) Amendment Act, 1981".

Commencement.

2. (1) This section and section 1 shall commence on the date of assent to this Act.

(2) Except as provided in subsection (1), this Act shall commence on the day appointed and notified under section 2 (2) of the Police Regulation (Deputy Commissioners) Amendment Act, 1981.

Amendment of various Acts.

3. An Act specified in Schedule 1 is amended in the manner set forth in that Schedule in relation to that Act.

Omit "the Deputy Commissioner, the Senior Assistant Commissioner", insert instead "a Deputy Commissioner".

Statutory and Other Offices Remuneration Act, 1975 (1976, No. 4)—

(1) Schedule 2, Part 1—

Omit “Senior Assistant Commissioner of Police.” where firstly occurring.

(2) Schedule 2, Part 1—

Omit “, other than the Senior Assistant Commissioner of Police”.

Police Regulation (Allegations of Misconduct) Act, 1978, No. 84—

(1) Section 4, definition of “Deputy Commissioner”—

Omit “the Deputy”, insert instead “a Deputy”.

(2) Sections 11, 17 (1) (b), 49—

Omit “the Deputy” wherever occurring, insert instead “a Deputy”.
