Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (New South Wales) Amendment Act 1997 No 101

Act No 101, 1997

An Act to amend the *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (New South Wales) Act 1996* to exempt certain laws from the Trans-Tasman mutual recognition scheme. [Assented to 25 November 1997]

The Legislature of New South Wales enacts:

1 Name of Act

This Act is the Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (New South Wales) Amendment Act 1997.

2 Commencement

This Act commences on the date of assent.

3 Amendment of Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (New South Wales) Act 1996 No 102

The Schedule to the *Trans-Tasman Mutual Recognition (New South Wales) Act 1996* is amended by inserting the following matter at the end of clause 2 of Schedule 3 (Special exemptions) to the Commonwealth Bill:
