### **1 Name of plan**

This plan is *Cessnock Local Environmental Plan 2011 (Amendment No 38)*.

### **2 Commencement**

This plan commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

### **3 Land to which plan applies**

This plan applies to land in the following zones under *Cessnock Local Environmental Plan 2011*—

- (a) Zone RE1 Public Recreation,
- (b) Zone C2 Environmental Conservation,
- (c) Zone C3 Environmental Management,
- (d) Zone C4 Environmental Living.

## **Schedule 1      Amendment of Cessnock Local Environmental Plan 2011**

**[1] Land Use Table**

Omit “Signage;” from Zone RE1, item 3. Insert instead “; Signage”.

**[2] Land Use Table, Zone C2, item 1**

Insert at the end of the item—

- To provide for land uses compatible with the high ecological, scientific, cultural or aesthetic values of the zone.
- To protect, manage and restore Aboriginal cultural heritage, threatened ecological communities, key threatened species habitat, biodiversity corridors and important ecosystems.

**[3] Land Use Table, Zone C2, item 3**

Omit the following, with punctuation as appropriate—

Home-based child care  
Secondary dwellings  
Tourist and visitor accommodation

**[4] Land Use Table, Zone C2, item 3**

Insert the following in appropriate order, with punctuation as appropriate—

Bed and breakfast accommodation  
Building identification signs  
Business identification signs  
Community facilities  
Eco-tourist facilities  
Emergency services facilities  
Flood mitigation works  
Home businesses

**[5] Land Use Table, Zone C2, item 4**

Omit “Hotel or motel accommodation;”.

**[6] Land Use Table, Zone C3, item 1**

Insert at the end of the item—

- To protect, manage and restore Aboriginal cultural heritage, water quality, riparian and estuarine vegetation, biodiversity corridors and important ecosystems.
- To minimise the risk to the community and environment in areas subject to environmental hazards.
- To provide for low impact agricultural land uses on land with productive value.

**[7] Land Use Table, Zone C3, item 2**

Omit “Environmental protection works;”.

**[8] Land Use Table, Zone C3, item 3**

Insert the following in appropriate order, with punctuation as appropriate—

Building identification signs  
Business identification signs  
Camping grounds  
Community facilities  
Eco-tourist facilities  
Emergency services facilities  
Environmental protection works  
Extensive agriculture  
Farm buildings  
Home businesses  
Roadside stalls  
Tourist and visitor accommodation

**[9] Land Use Table, Zone C3, item 4**

Insert the following in appropriate order, with punctuation as appropriate—

Backpackers' accommodation  
Hotel or motel accommodation  
Serviced apartments

**[10] Land Use Table, Zone C4, item 1**

Insert at the end of the item—

- To protect, manage and restore biodiversity corridors and facilitate species movement.

**[11] Land Use Table, Zone C4, item 2**

Omit “Environmental protection works;” and “Home-based child care;”.

**[12] Land Use Table, Zone C4, item 3**

Omit the following, with punctuation as appropriate—

Animal boarding or training establishments  
Camping grounds  
Caravan parks  
Centre-based child care facilities  
Community facilities  
Emergency services facilities  
Environmental facilities  
Farm buildings  
Information and education facilities  
Landscaping material supplies  
Neighbourhood shops  
Passenger transport facilities  
Plant nurseries  
Research stations  
Respite day care centres  
Secondary dwellings

**[13] Land Use Table, Zone C4, item 3**

Insert “Eco-tourist facilities;” and “Environmental protection works;” in appropriate order.
