1 Name of plan

This plan is Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009 (Amendment No 56).

2 Commencement

This plan commences on the day on which it is published on the NSW legislation website.

3 Land to which plan applies

This plan applies to land to which Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009 applies.

4 Maps

The maps adopted by *Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009* are amended or replaced, as the case requires, by the maps approved by the local plan-making authority on the making of this plan.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009

[1] Clause 7.18 Design excellence in Wollongong city centre and at key sites

Insert ", landscape" after "architectural" in clause 7.18(1).

[2] Clause 7.18(4)(d)

Omit the paragraph. Insert instead—

- (d) whether the proposed development detrimentally overshadows the following—
 - (i) an area shown distinctively coloured and numbered on the Sun Plane Protection Map,
 - (ii) a site identified on the Overshadowing Map,

[3] Clause 7.18(4)(e)(xi) and (xii)

Omit "domain." from clause 7.18(4)(e)(x). Insert instead—

domain,

- (xi) achieving appropriate interfaces at ground level between buildings and the public domain,
- (xii) excellence and integration of landscape design.

[4] Clause 7.19

Omit the clause. Insert instead—

7.19 Active frontages

- (1) The objective of this clause is to promote uses that attract pedestrian traffic to ground floor frontages in the following zones—
 - (a) Zone E1 Local Centre,
 - (b) Zone E2 Commercial Centre,
 - (c) Zone MU1 Mixed Use.
- (2) This clause applies to land identified as "Active frontages" on the Active Frontages Map.
- (3) Development consent must not be granted to the erection of a building, or a change of use of a building, on land to which this clause applies unless the consent authority is satisfied that the building will have an active frontage after its erection or change of use.
- (4) Despite subclause (3), an active frontage is not required for a part of a building that is used for any of the following—
 - (a) entrances and lobbies, including as part of mixed use development,
 - (b) access for fire services,
 - (c) vehicular access or loading docks.
- (5) In this clause, a building has an *active frontage* if—
 - (a) all premises on the ground floor of the building facing the street or public open space are used for the purposes of business premises or retail premises, and
 - (b) the frontage enables direct visual and physical contact between the street or public open space and the interior of the building.

Note— Clearly defined entrances, windows, awnings and shop fronts are elements of a building facade that contribute to an active frontage.

[5] Part 7 Local provisions—general

Insert at the end of the part, with appropriate clause numbering—

Overshadowing of Memorial Park and Luke's Place Playground

- (1) The objective of this clause is to protect public open space at Memorial Park and Luke's Place Playground from overshadowing to ensure user amenity and the health of vegetation.
- (2) Development consent must not be granted to development that will result in a building causing—
 - (a) overshadowing of land identified as "Luke's Place Playground" on the Overshadowing Map between 10am and 2pm on 21 June in each year, or
 - (b) land identified as "Wilga Street Tennis Courts" on the Overshadowing Map to receive less than 3 hours of direct sunlight between 9am and 3pm on 21 June in each year, or
 - (c) land identified as "Memorial Main Ground" or "Memorial Outside Ground" on the Overshadowing Map to receive less than 4 hours of direct sunlight on 21 June in each year.

[6] Dictionary

Omit the definition of Active Street Frontages Map. Insert in alphabetical order—

Active Frontages Map means the Wollongong Local Environmental Plan 2009 Active Frontages Map.
