Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to repeal the *Justices (Short Descriptions of Impounding Offences) Regulation 1994* as a consequence of it having been superseded by the *Impounding (General) Regulation 1998*.

This Regulation is made under the *Justices Act 1902*, including section 154 (the general regulation-making power) and section 145B.

This Regulation is made in connection with the staged repeal of subordinate legislation under the *Subordinate Legislation Act 1989*.

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Justices (Short Descriptions of Impounding Offences) Repeal Regulation 1998*.

2 Commencement

This Regulation commences on 1 September 1998.

3 Notes

4 Repeal

The *Justices (Short Descriptions of Impounding Offences) Regulation 1994* is repealed.

5 Transitional provision

- (1) This clause applies to any information, complaint, summons, warrant, notice, order or other document (whether issued, given or made before or after the repeal of the *Justices (Short Descriptions of Impounding Offences) Regulation 1994*) that relates to an offence alleged to have been committed before that repeal.
- (2) The repeal of the *Justices (Short Descriptions of Impounding Offences) Regulation 1994* does not affect the validity of any information, complaint, summons, warrant, notice, order or other document in which an expression prescribed by that Regulation is used.
