Explanatory note

Schedule 2 to the *Confiscation of Proceeds of Crime Regulation 1996* sets out the fees payable to the Public Trustee in relation to property in respect of which the Public Trustee has taken control in accordance with a restraining order under the *Confiscation of Proceeds of Crime Act 1989*. The object of this Regulation is to increase those fees in order to cover the amount of any GST payable in respect of the matters for which the fees are payable to the Public Trustee.

This Regulation is made under the *Confiscation of Proceeds of Crime Act 1989*, including sections 53 and 95 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation
