Explanatory note

The *Public Finance and Audit Act 1983* provides for an *officer of an authority* to exercise functions relating to the committing or incurring of expenditure and the authorising of payment of accounts. The object of this Regulation is to amend the *Public Finance and Audit Regulation 2000* to prescribe a member of staff of the Office of Co-ordinator General of Rail as an *officer of an authority* in relation to the State Rail Authority.

This Regulation is made under the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1983*, including the definition of *officer of an authority* in section 4 (1) and section 64 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Public Finance and Audit Amendment (Office of Co-ordinator General of Rail) Regulation 2002*.

2 Amendment of Public Finance and Audit Regulation 2000

The *Public Finance and Audit Regulation 2000* is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

Schedule 1 Amendment

(Clause 2)

Clause 17 Definitions of “authority” and “officer of an authority”

Omit subclause (7). Insert instead:

- (7) For the purposes of the definition of *officer of an authority* in section 4 (1) of the Act, the following are prescribed in relation to the State Rail Authority, but only for the purposes of exercising functions under sections 12 and 13 of the Act:
 - (a) an employee of the Rail Infrastructure Corporation,
 - (b) a member of staff of the Office of Co-ordinator General of Rail.
