Explanatory note

The objects of this Regulation are:

- (a) to extend, until 30 June 2004, the operation of the compensation scheme under sections 78 and 78A of the *Firearms Act 1996* for surrendering pistols and certain associated items, and
- (b) to extend, until 30 June 2004, the general amnesty for surrendering (without compensation) illegally held firearms to the police.

This Regulation is made under the *Firearms Act 1996*, including section 78 (1) and 88 (the general regulation-making power).
