Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to make it clear that each identifier that is prescribed as a security indicator for the purposes of section 47 (2) (c) of the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act 1999* (which provides for photographic evidence of speeding offences) consists of a series of 48 characters that is an individual combination of letters, numbers or symbols (instead of, as at present, letters, numbers and symbols).

This Regulation is made under the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) Act 1999*, including sections 47 (2) (c) and 71 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) (Road Rules) Amendment Regulation 2004*.

2 Amendment of Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) (Road Rules) Regulation 1999

The *Road Transport (Safety and Traffic Management) (Road Rules) Regulation 1999* is amended by omitting from clause 156A (Security indicators: section 47 (2) (c) of the Act) the words “letters, numbers and symbols” and by inserting instead the words “letters, numbers or symbols”.
