His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulation under the *Fisheries Management Act 1994*.

Explanatory note

The object of this Regulation is to convert a number of fishing closures that currently have effect under section 8 of the *Fisheries Management Act 1994* for a period of up to 5 years to permanent prohibitions under that Act.

In particular, the Regulation amends a number of regulations to make provision for or with respect to the following:

- (a) restricting certain classes of commercial and recreational fishing using various methods in specified areas and during specified periods,
- (b) prohibiting spearfishing in certain waters,
- (c) prescribing certain conditions of permits for research and other purposes,
- (d) providing for certain daily bag limits in respect of specified fish species,
- (e) providing for the manner in which pipis may be taken,
- (f) prohibiting the taking of bluefish,
- (g) protecting southern bluefin tuna from commercial fishing,
- (h) providing for other minor and miscellaneous changes.

This Regulation is made under the *Fisheries Management Act 1994*, including sections 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 37, 40, 60, 68 and 289 (the general regulation-making power).

1 Name of Regulation

This Regulation is the Fisheries Management Legislation Amendment (Fishing Closures) Regulation 2008.

Amendment of Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002

The Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002 is amended as set out in Schedule 1.

Amendment of other Fisheries Management legislation

The Regulations specified in Schedule 2 are amended as set out in that Schedule.

[1] Clause 6 Protected fish

Insert in alphabetical order in Part 1 of the Table to clause 6:

Bluefish

Girella cyanea

[2] Clause 6 (2)

Insert at the end of clause 6:

- (2) For the purposes of section 21 (1) (d) of the Act, it is a defence to a prosecution for an offence under section 19 of the Act constituted by taking or being in possession of bluefish if the person charged satisfies the Court that:
 - (a) the bluefish were taken from Lord Howe Island waters, and
 - (b) the person's possession of the fish would, but for the fish being protected fish, be lawful.

[3] Clause 7 Fish protected from commercial fishing

Insert in Part 1 of the Table, after the item relating to striped Marlin:

Tuna, southern bluefin

Thunnus maccoyii

[4] Clause 8A Prohibition on certain classes of commercial fishing

Omit "Waterways Authority" wherever occurring in the matter relating to the Clarence River in the Table.

Insert instead "Maritime Authority of NSW".

[5] Clause 8B

Insert after clause 8A:

8B Prohibited classes of fishing—recreational and inland restricted fishery

(1) A person must not engage in a prohibited class of recreational or commercial (inland) fishing.

Maximum penalty: 100 penalty units.

Schedule 1 Amendment of Fisheries Management (General) Regulation 2002

- (2) A person engages in a *prohibited class of recreational or commercial (inland) fishing* if the person takes, from an area specified in column 1 of Schedule 2, fish of a kind specified next to that area in column 2 of that Schedule using a method specified next to that area in column 3 of that Schedule during the period or periods specified in column 4 of that Schedule.
- (3) Except as otherwise provided by this clause, this clause does not apply in respect of a commercial fisher taking fish for sale as authorised under the Act.
- (4) This clause extends to a commercial fisher taking fish in the inland restricted fishery.

[6] Part 2, Division 3, Table

Omit "Bar cod" from Part 1 of the Table. Insert instead "Banded rockcod".

[7] Clause 21 Use of nets and traps prohibited in certain waters (Brisbane Waters, Port Hacking etc)

Omit the clause.

[8] Clause 128A

Insert after clause 128:

128A Taking of pipis for use as bait only

- (1) A person must not take pipis except for use as bait.
 - Maximum penalty: 100 penalty units.
- (2) A person must not take pipis unless the person is in the authorised area for the taking of pipis.
 - Maximum penalty: 100 penalty units.
- (3) A person must not remove pipis from the authorised area for the taking of pipis.
 - Maximum penalty: 100 penalty units.
- (4) This clause does not apply:
 - (a) in respect of the taking of, or removal of, pipis by a person who is a commercial fisher authorised to take them under the Act, or
 - (b) in respect of the removal of pipis by any other person if the pipis were taken by a commercial fisher and were purchased or otherwise acquired by the person.
- (5) In this clause, *the authorised area for the taking of pipis* is the area within 50 metres of the mean high water mark of a beach.

Prescribed conditions of section 37 permits

- For the purposes of section 37 (4) (a) of the Act, it is a condition of a permit under section 37 of the Act that the permit holder does not take fish from waters specified in column 1 of the Table to this clause using a method specified next to those waters in column 2 of the Table.
- In the Table to this clause, longitude and latitude coordinates are (2) in WGS84 datum, unless otherwise provided.
